AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT by submitting the manuscript identified above for publishing by the Canadian Health Policy Journal (CHPJ), authors will comply with the following terms and conditions.

Assignment of Copyrights

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT they are assigning to CHPI exclusive temporary copyright to the manuscript during the review and editing process, and if accepted for publishing, exclusive permanent copyright to the final published article (“article”) relating to the title or any version of the title identified above and any associated tables, illustrations or other material submitted for publication. This assignment of rights means that CHPI will own the exclusive right to publish, reproduce, and distribute the article, or any part of the article, in print, electronic and all other media (whether now known or later developed), in any form, in all languages, throughout the world, in perpetuity, and the right to license others to do the same, effective when the article is accepted for publication.

Scope

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT the scope of CHPI’s copyright includes the published journal article, defined as the final document, digital or hardcopy, that appears or will appear in the journal and embodies all value-adding publisher activities including review co-ordination, copy-editing, formatting, pagination, and online enrichment; and also includes the unique combination of wording, text, data, images, charts and tables, etc. embodied in the article; and also includes the particular wording of article titles.

Subscription Paywall

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT they are aware that CHPJ is a paid access journal and articles will be published behind a subscription paywall. CHPJ makes some articles available free of charge to the public, if an open access sponsorship is received to recover the associated organizational expenses related to publishing, and the opportunity costs related to forgone sales revenue. The source of all open access sponsorships will be disclosed in the article or on the landing pages associated with the article. Potential sources of open access sponsorship include foundations, institutions, universities, granting agencies, associations, societies, industry, businesses, government, and non-governmental organizations. Authors may also sponsor open access to their own article out of funds received from a research grant.

Third Parties

Whereas authors are not employed by CHPI or CHPJ, and independently initiated an unsolicited submission of a manuscript for publishing consideration by CHPJ, and whereas CHPI has not received any funding from, and is under no contractual obligation to any third parties associated with the article submission, and whereas CHPJ is under no obligation to publish (and will not publish in any case) article submissions that are encumbered by contractual obligations to third parties that would impose conditions or restrictions on CHPI/CHPJ, or that would limit or infringe upon CHPI's independence and/or copyrights, or that are subject to copyrights (including non-exclusive copyrights) belonging to any third-party, AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT:

1. Authors must disclose to CHPJ all contractual obligations and funding relationships involving third parties associated with the article submission.
2. Authors have not assigned and will not assign to any third parties any copyrights (exclusive or non-exclusive) to the manuscript submitted to CHPJ.
3. Authors intend the manuscript to be exclusively published by CHPJ and agree to permanently assign to CHPI all copyrights pertaining to both the article submitted and the final article published.
4. Authors understand that CHPI/CHPJ earns income from sales of articles and subscriptions, and that CHPI/CHPJ has an existential commercial interest in maintaining the integrity of its paywall and in preventing breaches of its copyrights.
5. Authors have informed any third-party funders associated with the article submission that upon acceptance for publishing, all copyrights to the published article will be owned exclusively by CHPI in perpetuity; and that unauthorized copying, reproduction, distribution, posting or publishing CHPI content is strictly prohibited without written permission from CHPI.

Review

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT they understand articles submitted to CHPJ are subject to formal review and critique by CHPJ editorial staff, CHPI affiliated researchers and independent external experts in health economics and health policy, representing diverse perspectives. CHPJ review is a double-blind process whenever possible, meaning that it is preferred that the authors not be identified to the reviewers, nor that the reviewers be identified to the authors. CHPJ editorial staff manage the review process as neutral referees. The CHPJ review process is focused on identifying substantive issues that might disqualify an article from being published including non-scientific methods, factual and analytical errors and omissions, data inaccuracy, misinterpretation of data and analytical results, illogical arguments and conclusions, illiterate text, and plagiarism or misattribution of credit for the originality of the titles, text, methods and ideas presented. Published research is ultimately open to intellectual debate, scholarly scrutiny, critical examination, empirical verification, and methodological replication to assess and confirm its accuracy and validity.

Withdrawal

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT they understand upon submission, CHPI begins to incur costs associated with the review and publishing process, therefore the manuscript cannot be withdrawn after submission without permission from CHPI.

Originality

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT they understand the article submitted to the journal must be original, written by the stated authors and not previously published. The article must not be submitted to any other journal. The article and any supplemental materials must not infringe any copyright, violate any other intellectual property, privacy or other rights of any person or entity, or contain any libelous or other unlawful matter. Authors must obtain written permission from copyright owners for any excerpts from copyrighted works that are included and credit the sources in the article or supplemental materials.

Errors and Corrections

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT they understand if the published article is found to be in error, the authors are obligated to make the corrections, then CHPJ will edit the article, and post an updated version with a note disclosing the changes.

Author Rights

AUTHORS AGREE AND AFFIRM THAT they understand if the article is rejected for publishing, all copyrights revert to the authors. Articles may sometimes be accepted for publication but later rejected, in which case all rights will revert to the authors. Authors retain the right to be credited for the published article and all original research, analysis, wording, and ideas embodied in the published article that are legitimately attributable to the authors. Authors retain the right to use the article exclusively for their own personal uses limited to the author's classroom teaching (including distribution of copies, paper or electronic), presentation by the authors at a meeting or conference (including distribution of copies to the delegates attending such meeting), distribution of copies (including through e-mail) to collaborating research colleagues, use in a subsequent compilation of the author's works, inclusion in the author's thesis or dissertation, or in the author's other derivative works such as extending the article to book-length form, or otherwise using or re-using portions or excerpts in the author's other works; and in all of the aforementioned cases, only with full acknowledgment of the original publication of the article.
