Prescription drug plan coverage 2016: how many Canadians were insured, underinsured or uninsured?

## **Description**

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On February 27, 2018, the federal government established an Advisory Council on the Implementation of National Pharmacare. Pharmacare is proposed as a national, universal-coverage, publicly-funded, government-run, single-payer monopoly that would entirely replace Canada's current pluralistic system of federal-provincial-territorial publicly-funded government-run drug plans, and employment-based private drug plans. One of the main reasons cited to justify a national pharmacare program is a claim (based on a misinterpretation of widely publicized surveys about prescription cost-related non-adherence) that millions of Canadians are not covered by any type of drug plan. This study examines prescription drug plan coverage across Canada to determine how many people were insured, underinsured or uninsured.
